Bicester for shopping, then please walk if you are able to.


Bike - the Healthy Way

By Bus

By Car

Please park elsewhere, leaving



the small number of spaces for less able patients.

Option 1

Bicester Park and Ride car park at Kingsmere is free for 24 hours.

Take the S5 bus to Community Hospital Bicester.

The surgery is a 3 minute walk from the stop. Return fare £2.50 (July 2019), or use bus pass.

Option 2

If you are driving a less able patient, drop the person off, and park elsewhere. Arrange to pick them up as required.

Option 3

Cherwell Community and Volunteer Service offer an in-town Bicester driver service for £5 return for distances under 10 miles. Call 01295 266090. Give as much notice as possible, at least 3 working days.
